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
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## B. COM AND BSW STUDENTS FEEDBACK ON THE SYLLABUS 2019-20






**Figure 1: Rating on the difficulty level of the syllabus:** Out of 151 students, 5.3% of students feel that the syllabus is very easy, 21.9% feels it's easy, 64.2% finds it average, while 7.9% finds it difficult and 0.7% of the students finds it very difficult.

#### 2. The workload of the papers in semester






**Figure 3: Depth of Content of Syllabus:** Out of 150 students it is revealed that 11.3% finds it excellent, 56.7% finds it good, 30.7% says its fair, while 0.7% says its poor and another 0.7% finds it very poor.





Figure 5: The topics covered in syllabus are intellectually challenging and stimulating: Out of 150 students, 12.0% strongly agree, 56.7% agree, 28.0% are neutral about it while 3.3% disagree and 0.0% strongly disagree with it.




**Figure 6: Able to learn and understand the topics mentioned in the syllabus:** Out of 151 students, 12.6% strongly agree and 56.3% agree with it, while 27.2% of students are neutral about it, 4.0% of students disagree and 0.0% strongly disagree.




**Figure 7: The courses in the syllabus have relevance in social context:** Out of 151 students, 11.9% of strongly agree, 57.6% agree with it, while 27.8% are neutral about it, 2.6% disagrees and 0.0% strongly disagrees.




**Figure 8: The topics in the syllabus allow student-centric learning process:** Out of a total of 151 students, 11.9% strongly agree, 63.6% agree, while 21.9% are neutral about it and 2.0% of students disagree and 0.7% who strongly disagree.




Figure 10: The courses in the syllabus have enhanced competency in knowledge and skills: Out of 151 students, 15.2% strongly agree, 56.3% agrees while 24.5% are neutral about it and 4.0% disagree and 0.0% to strongly disagree with it.





Figure 11: The syllabus creates an interest to learn more about the topics/areas covered: Out of 150 students, 12.7% strongly agree, 54.7% agrees, while 27.3% are neutral about it and 4.7% disagree and 0.7% to strongly disagree with it.




**Figure 12: There is an inclusion of current topics in the syllabus:** Out of 151 students, 10.6% strongly agree, 43.7% agrees, while 41.1% neutral and 4.6% disagree and 0.0% strongly disagrees.




**Figure 13: The curriculum provides adequate stability between theoretical and practical courses:** Out of 150 students, 14.0% strongly agree, 47.3% just agree while 32.7% are neutral about it and 5.3% disagree and 0.7% to strongly disagree.




Figure 15: The course in the syllabus offers enough coverage in inter-disciplinary fields: Out of 150 students, 11.1% strongly agree and 51.3% agree with it while 33.3% are neutral about it and 3.3% disagree and 0.7% to strongly disagree with it.




Figure 16: The curriculum equips students for higher education in reputed national and international universities: Out of 149 students, 8.7% strongly agree, 53.0% agree while 30.9% are neutral and 7.4% disagree and 0.0% to strongly disagree with it.




Figure 17: The curriculum provides exposure for learning through interaction with various industry/institutions/organizations etc.: Out of 150 students, 11.3% strongly




Figure 18: The curriculum's flexibility in exposing students to opportunities that involves self-learning and experiential learning: Out of 150 students, 14.7% strongly








**Figure 20:** The changes like to be brought in the syllabus: Out 149 students, 33.6% opts for 'every theoretical lesson should be followed up with appropriate practical courses', 27.5% wants easy access to materials that provide coverage of the syllabus, 12.8% says that the areas covered in the syllabus should not be repetitive, 20.1% says that the syllabus should be job-oriented while 6.0% opts for 'others'.
