All glory to God who has shown His predilection towards Don Bosco College, Itanagar, for yet another year. The academic year 2018-19 beamed with life and wonderful happenings brought forth laurels to the Institution. With grateful heart I present to you the annual report of our College and this College Magazine which is the fruit of the hard work of our students and teachers.

1. **Official Inauguration of Academic Year:** Though the new academic year started on 31st July, the official inauguration was held on 4th August 2018 where Shri Kime Aya IPS, Assistant Inspector General of Police (AIGP), Arunachal Pradesh, was the Chief Guest.
2. **Starting of the Department of Social Work:** The Department of Social Work (BSW) in Don Bosco College, Itanagar, was established in the year 2018. We are the first in the entire state to offer Bachelor of Social Work under Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU). Twenty students were enrolled for Honours programme in the year 2018 and Mr. Francis Hasdak & Mr. Telesphore Topno are the first Assistant Professors of the Department.
3. **Orientation Programme for 1st Year Students:** Two days of orientation programme was organized for the new students of the College by the Assistant Professors of DBC Itanagar on 2 & 3 August 2018. Mr. Francis Hasdak and Mr. Telesphore Topno made the students feel at home by making them understand who Don Bosco is and by explaining to them the rules and regulations of the College. HoD's of various departments met the students and guided them to choose right subject combinations.
4. **National Seminar:** The Department of Commerce organized two days National Seminar on 10 & 11 August, 2018, on the topic "Role of Financial Institutions and MSMEs in the Socio-Economic Development of Northeast India". It was sponsored by NABARD Itanagar and ICSSR North Eastern Regional Centre Shillong. Shri L. 6. **Freshers' Day and Birthday of Don Bosco:** 16th August 2018 witnessed the Freshers' Day celebrations with lots of pomp and gaiety. This day also marked the 16th anniversary of the foundation day of our College and the Birthday of Don Bosco. Miss Tanyang Kanya was crowned as the Miss Fresher and Mr. Torik Pado was crowned as the Mr. Fresher.
7. **Graduation Day Cum Felicitation of Rank Holders:** 21st August was a memorable day for the graduates and rank holders of DBC. Fieldwork

Fieldwork is an integral part of the training in Social work. Field work programme consists of observation visits to the agencies, institutions and community settings, rural camp study tour and direct practice of social work skills for intervention, under the guidance of professional social workers in selected placements.

In the first semester, the trainee social work students were sent to OJU Mission, Naharlagun, and CWC (Child Welfare Committee) Capital complex Itanagar.

Don Bosco College offers the best learning opportunities to the students through series of workshop. In the First Semester two workshops were conducted. Below are the reports of these workshops.

Theatre Workshop

Theatre workshop was organised for the students of Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) of the 1st Semester from 29th to 31st August, 2018. The workshop was facilitated by the following resource persons - Mrs. Gyatri Doley and Mr. Anirban B Gohain of Govt College, Gogamukh.

The first day of the workshop was geared to opening up the students from their fears, stage fright and other inhibitions through exercises and games. They were taught voice modulation, different expressions, and they were introduced the concept of Street play and Drama. The second day of the workshop was centred around learning to Act. The students were engaged in many activities. Singing, acting and group discussion were very much part of the program. They were introduced to the concept of analysing the community and thereafter grading the issues and problems of the community. The students also had to come up with a street play as the outcome of the workshop and perform it.

The students performed the drama on the last day of the workshop under the guidance of the facilitators in the college campus. The students gained confidence and came out of their stage fear. They have learned the art of acting and the basics of street play and drama which in turn, in the practice of social work will unearth for themselves the art.



Participatory Rural Appraisal Workshop

A two day Participatory Rural Appraisal (PRA) Workshop was organised on 21st and 22nd October, 2018 for the first semester students of Bachelor of Social Work (BSW). Sir Probin Topno Asst. Professor Bosco Institute, Jorhat was the resource person for the workshop. The workshop commenced with Sir Topno educating the students with the knowledge of Participatory Rural Appraisal and highlighting the importance of the tool in the practice of Social Work. They were taught various tools of Participatory Rural Appraisal in detail and explained how the resources are collected using the tool. The tools are as follows:

- a) Transact walk
- b) Seasonal Calendar
- c) Mobility Map
- d) Social Map
- e) Ranking and Scoring
- f) Tele-Marketing
- g) Resource mapping



The day two of the workshop was organised to do the practical on the theory learnt. Daath village was adopted for the practical and the leaders and the community heads of the village were the stakeholders for the data. The Village Community Hall was chosen as a venue for the practical sessions. Different groups were organised to get the data from the stakeholders. After the interaction there were presentations of the data and resources in the presence of the community heads and leaders which was followed by evaluation of the workshop. The workshop came to an end in a happy note. The tools learned plays a big role in collecting information from the communities or any given work. It aids in analysing the given social criteria in order to develop or materialise the projects.

Graphics and Mind mapping Workshop

Two day workshop on “Graphics and Mind Mapping” was conducted for the students of Social Work on 22nd and 23rd of March, 2019. Mr. Rahul Bora, Founder of Thought to Action NGO, and Yanji Janger Researcher of Innovation Hub, Jorhat were the resource persons. A mind map is an easy way to brainstorm thoughts originally without worrying about order and structure. The whole workshop was designed with games, lectures, and practical activities. The students were introduced to Graphics and its use in the social work. Each step was guided by the facilitator to come out with innovative ideas. They were taught typography and its daily application in the field of Social Work. On 23rd March, 2019 BSW students presented the mind maps and Graphics to the students of the campus. Graphic and mind map is an important tool to be a changeloomer.

1st BSW Annual Day - UTSAV 2019

The students of Social work celebrated its 1st Edition of UTSAV on 2nd May, 2019 with pomp and gaiety. It was inaugurated by the Principal of the college Fr. (Dr.) Jose George. The Utsav was followed by cultural programme, sharing of experiences and presentations by the trainee Social Work Students. for the citizen to know about the new law and its protection and enforcement of Tribal Rights.

Awareness Programme on RTI

The State Information Commission (SIC), Government of Arunachal Pradesh was kind enough to invite the college to be a part in their Awareness programme on Right to Information Act, 2005. In response to the said invitation, 30 students of the Department with Mr. Paul (HoD) had attended and represented our college. The event focused on the theme, "For Effective and Efficient implementation of Right to Information Act, 2005." The programme was organized by Arunachal Pradesh Information Commission (APIC) in collaboration with DOPT, Govt. of India, on 12th October, 2018 at Banquet Hall, Itanagar, Arunachal Pradesh.

4. 10th DEPARTMENTAL SEMINAR

Topic: “Consumer protection Act 1986-with special reference to Itanagar”

Resource Person: Mr Taba Amrit, Assistant Controller Legal Metrology and Consumer Affairs, Yupia, Government of Arunachal Pradesh.

The Department organized the 10th Departmental Seminar on 2nd April, 2019, on the topic “Consumer Protection Act 1986-with Special Reference to Itanagar”. The Seminar paper was presented by five groups i.e., Introduction of Consumer Protection act 1986, Study on Entrepreneur, Study on Customer and Seller, and Interpretation and Analysis of Consumer Protection.

The students of B. Com VI Semester actively participated in the seminar. All the papers were presented in power point. The students gave their best to present their respective Parts. In question hours students asked many questions and the paper presenters knowledgeably replied all the queries.

The Seminar concluded with the valuable discussion regarding Consumer Protection Act and its scopes, prospects and complexity for entrepreneurs, customers and specially the State Government. Resource person also spoke on the importance of Consumer Protection Act in state. He was highly optimistic on Consumer Protection Act 1986 implementation which help the consumer to fight against mal-practices and fraud etc.

5. NATIONAL SEMINAR

The Department of Commerce, Don Bosco College, Itanagar, organized Two-Day National Seminar in collaboration with National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD) and ICSSR on “**Role of Financial Institutions and MSMEs in the Socio-economic Development of Northeast India**”. The seminar focused on Financial Institutions including both banking and non-banking institutions that play crucial role in the growth and development of the region. The banking financial institutions such as all Public and Private Sector Banks, Regional Rural Banks, etc., and non-banking financial institutions like NABARD, SIDBI, SFCs, SIDCs, etc., are the key financial institutions which are providing all kinds of support and assistance to the people for the growth and development of the region. Unorganized Financial Institutions such as landlords, local brokers, SHGs, NGOs, Associations, Societies etc., also contribute in the socio-economic growth of the region. Besides Financial Institutions, MSMEs also contribute significantly in the socio-economic development of the region by generating employment, promoting infrastructural development, improving the living standard of the people and by encouraging trade and commerce.

The seminar was held on August 10 and 11, 2018, at Don Bosco College, Itanagar, in which teams of senior Government officials, professors, sponsored bank general manager, senior politicians and other sector officials related to MSMEs and Financial Institutions were brought together. All together there were 16 resource persons, 19 Seminar Papers and 60 participants who participated



and acknowledged that the Financial Institutions and MSMEs are integral parts of socio-economic development of Northeast India. The broader initiative and boost provided by government and various agencies are highly important to uplift the economy of Northeast India with the mainstream.

SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS

In the Two-Day National Seminar held on 10th and 11th August, 2018, 100 participants from various states of India attended the Seminar. In the inaugural session the Chief Guest, Guest of Honour and Key Note Speaker chaired the session which was followed by the first in-put session with five renowned Resource Persons. In total the Seminar had three in-put sessions where 14 resource persons interacted with the paper presenters and participants in the two technical sessions. A total of 19 papers were presented in the two-day National Seminar. The seminar provided a good opportunity to foster the promotion of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and role of financial institutions in promotion of MSMEs. The Resource Persons shared their knowledge and experience on the areas of the seminar which was highly encouraging and insightful.

The emergence and growth of Sociology discipline bears the imprint of Western sociology. Sociology as a science of society, studies its social institutions, social groups, social processes and organizations. It emerged in the Western society out of a socio-historical background which had its origins in the Enlightenment Period. This Period embodied the scientific and technological revolution, Intellectual revolution and the Commercial revolution in Europe, on the one hand, and the French Revolution in 1789 on the other.

The Industrial Revolution in England was the result of the Technological developments which had taken place during the Enlightenment Period brought very deep rooted changes in the nature of society and role of the individual. It had given rise to mass poverty, social evils and cultural problems. All these events gave the scholars and thinkers of that period reason to develop a science of society which could deal with these problems, find solutions, to understand the nature of these problems and to ameliorate the condition of the poor masses that were living a life of abject poverty, crime and delinquency, and other social evils.

The Department has four Assistant professors i.e. Pouluanthai Phaomei (Samuel) the Head of the Department, Jananko Tingwa, Sr. Fatima Kashungnao fma and Dr. Lalgin Chongloi vibrantly leading the department. We also acknowledge the contributions made by Sir Token Tadu, Assistant Professor in his short stay with us. We wish him luck in his endeavors. At present the department has 39 students enrolled in the Honours Sociology, 367 students in 2nd semester and 290 students in 4th semester as their elective subject.

Mentoring: The B.A. 6th semester students were divided into four groups and guided by the teachers. They mentor each of the students in academic as well as non-academic matters for their overall development and growth. Personal and academic information of each and every student was collected. Mentoring is done with an aim to enable students to be good citizens in the future.

Annual Departmental Seminar

The Department of Sociology, Don Bosco College, Itanagar organized its Annual Departmental Seminar on 30th of March 2019 on the topic, "Youth Unrest in North East: With Special Reference to Arunachal Pradesh". The seminar began with the reception of the Resource Person Shri Bikash Bage, HoD of Sociology, Rajiv Gandhi University along with the opening song from the students' of the department. A short speech was delivered by Fr. Dr. Jose George, the Principal of the college, highlighting the pertinence of the seminar topic. The papers were presented by nine students on various issues, starting from the technical terms used in collection of data, the meaning of youth, youth unrest and few cases of youth unrest in Arunachal Pradesh i.e. NERIST director issue, NIT Jote Issue, PRC issue, Chakma-Hajong issue, Stipend and Scholarship Issue etc. After the presentation of the papers, there was a technical session moderated by Ms. Jananko Tingwa, Assistant Professor.
