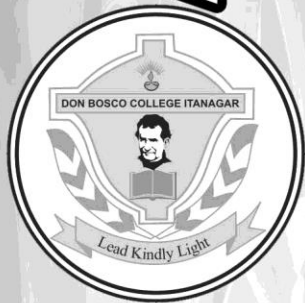

26. The Semester Examinations were held from May 5<sup>th</sup> to June 3<sup>rd</sup> 2017.

These are some of the events that we have witnessed in the Academic year 2016-17.

The Final year BA students who were the last batch of the Annual System performed quite well in the RGU Examinations of 2016. They brought in an overall of 27 Ranks. We had 3 ranks (5, 6, 9) in Economics; 5 ranks (1, 2, 4, 6, 7) in English; 5 ranks (1, 2, 5, 7,10) in History; 4 ranks (1, 2, 5, 9) in



Political Science; 10 ranks (1, 2, 3(2), 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10) in Sociology. Ms Millo Chanya Nancy of the department of English secured 8<sup>th</sup> position in the overall Top Ten of the University. The first batch of B.Com. students appeared for the first time the 6<sup>th</sup> Semester examinations and they secured two ranks, 8 and 9. So far, as a college we are still securing the highest number of ranks. Congratulations to the achievers and the faculty members of the various departments for their hard and dedicated works.

The Rank Holders were awarded Certificates and Cash Awards. The Best students of each department were given Awards, sponsored by the Hon'ble Parliamentary Secretary, Shri Panyi Taram (MLA, Koloriang AC). The best student of the department who got First Class received Rs. 10,000 each, and those who got Second Class received Rs. 5000.

It may be pointed out that the college has provided White boards in all the classrooms and done away with chalk. We have also added technology into the classrooms. All the Major Subject Classrooms and the 3 classrooms of the Department of Commerce have been installed a desktop and LCD Projectors with projection screens. The staff and students can engage themselves with multimedia classes. Moreover, the College has succeeded in getting WiFi Broadband service to give fillip to internet connections. We have also installed LMS (Learning Management System) to assist greater learning.

Besides the normal academic activities as per the curriculum of the University, the various departments also conducted certificate courses for the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> semesters students. They successfully completed the course and were conferred certificates. A Skill training programme FOOD and BEVERAGES, under NSDC facilitated by DB Tech was conducted in the college and about 11 students sat for the exams to be certified.

An extension building to house Bus parking, Canteen, Alumni Office, Library and a Hall for workshops and seminars and other programmes of the college is nearing completion. It will begin to serve its purposes in the next Session 2017-18.

The college hope to begin the course in BSW (Bachelor of Social Work) as soon as the University grants the permission. We shall also try to offer other skill training programmes and certificate courses.

As I close the narration of the Academic Year 2016-17, I would like to express sincere words of gratitude to everyone who have contributed to the good and success of the 2016-17 session. The Fathers, teaching staff, non-teaching staff, supporting staff, College Welfare committee members, Govt. Officials of various departments, alumni, well-wishers, students etc., have contributed much to the good of the college. Above all, I acknowledge the blessings of God on all. ## Departmental Seminar

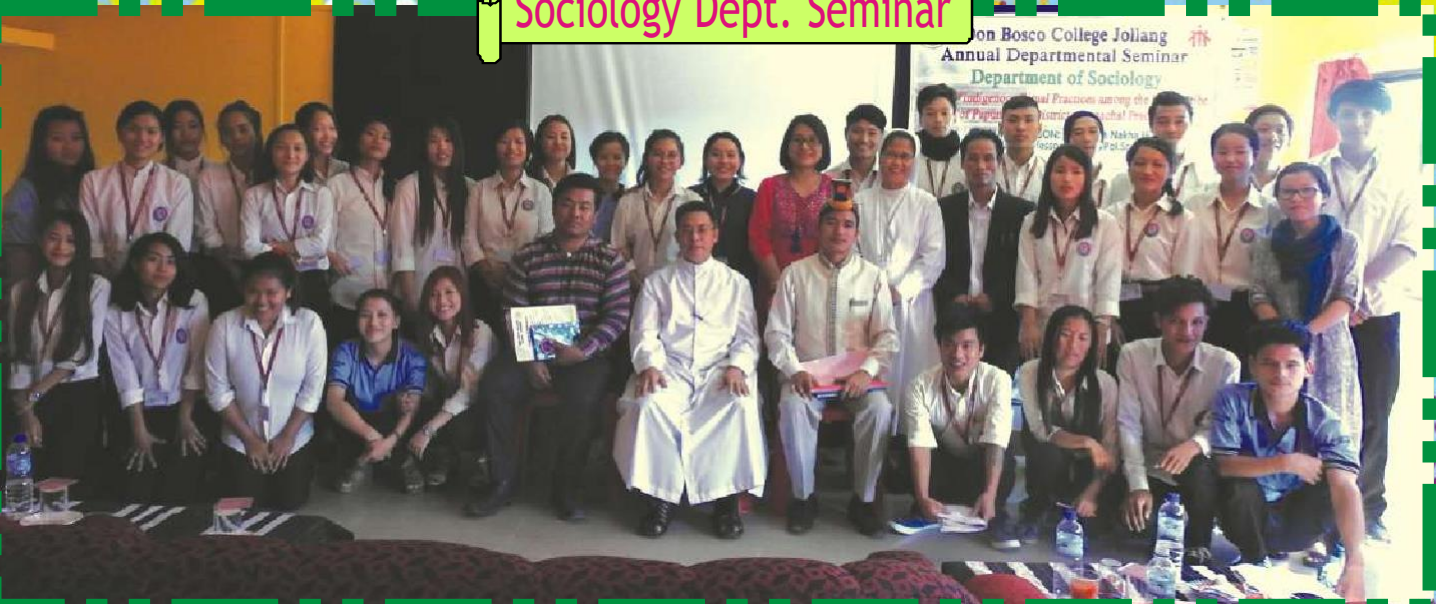




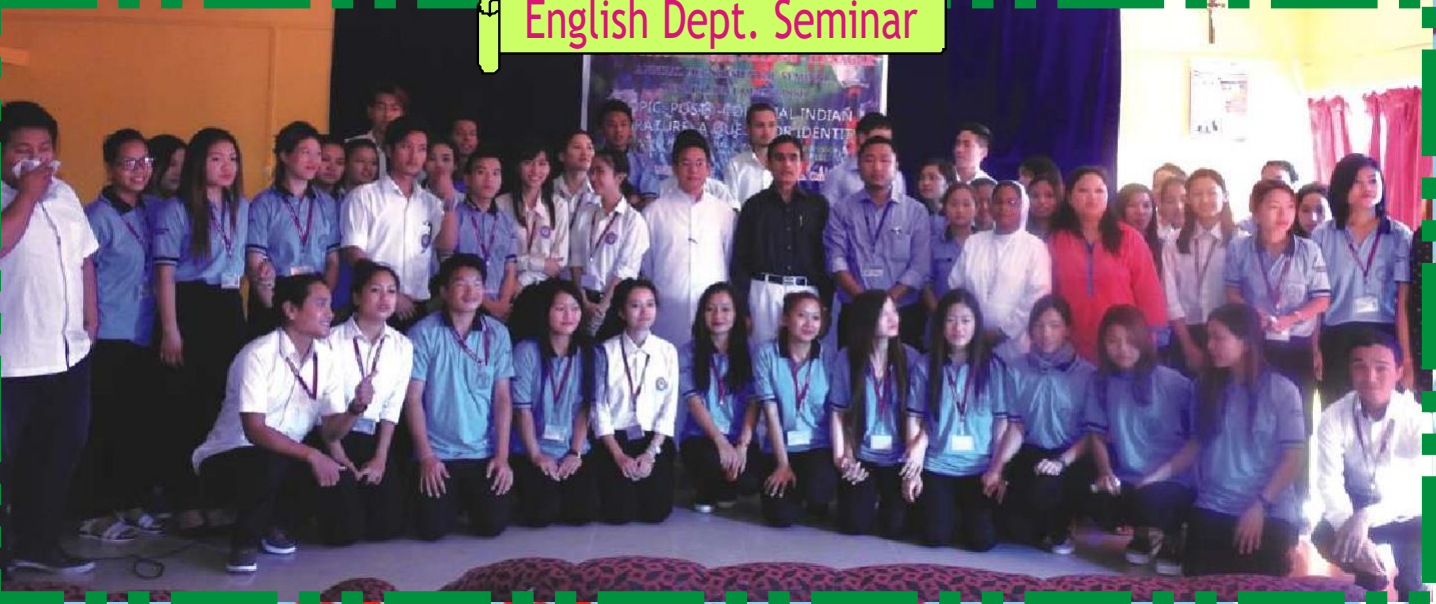

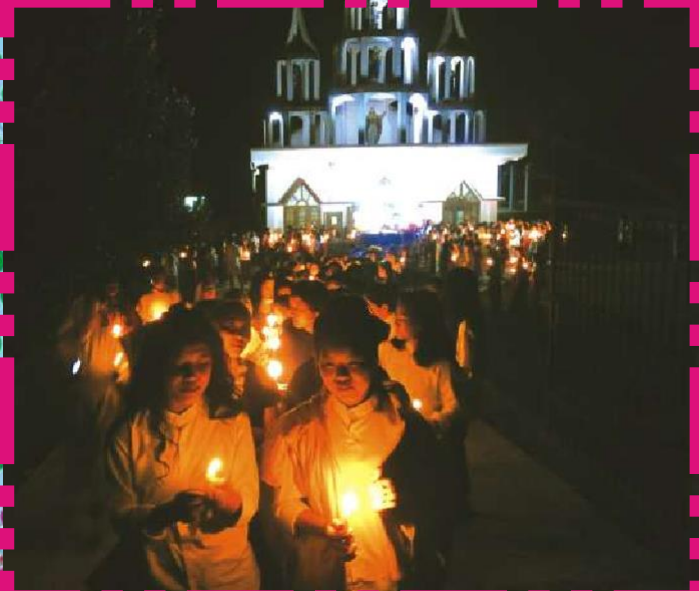
