


Figure 1: Rating on the difficulty level of the syllabus

2. The workload of the papers in semester





Figure 2: Rating the workload of the papers in semester




Figure 3: Rating on the Depth of content of syllabus.




Figure 4: Rating the completion of the syllabus on time.

5. The topics covered in syllabus are intellectually challenging and stimulating




Figure 5: Whether the topics covered in syllabus are intellectually challenging and stimulating.

6. Able to learn and understand the topics mentioned in the syllabus




Figure 6: Whether students are able to learn and understand the topics mentioned in the syllabus




Figure 7: Whether the courses in the syllabus have relevance in the social context




Figure 8: Whether topics in the syllabus allow student-centric learning process




Figure 9: Whether material on the concerned topics in the syllabus is accessible

10. The courses in the syllabus have enhanced competency in knowledge and skills




Figure 10: Whether courses in the syllabus have enhanced competency in knowledge and skills




Figure 11: Whether syllabus creates an interest to learn more about the topics/ areas covered.

12. There is an inclusion of current topics in the syllabus




Figure 12: Whether there is an inclusion of current topics in the syllabus

13. The syllabus is career oriented




Figure 13: Whether syllabus is career oriented

14. The syllabus offers sufficient knowledge on the fundamental concepts




Figure 14: Whether syllabus offers sufficient knowledge on the fundamental concepts

15. The curriculum offers enough coverage on elective courses in interdisciplinary fields




Figure 15: Whether the curriculum offers enough coverage on elective courses in interdisciplinary fields.




Figure 16: Whether the curriculum equips students for higher education in reputed national and international universities




Figure 17: Whether the curriculum's flexibility in exposing students to opportunities that involves self-learning and experiential learning




Figure 18: Whether changes like to be brought in the syllabus

19. Request the authorities of RGU to bring some changes in the syllabus




Figure 19: Whether request the authorities of RGU to bring some changes in the syllabus
